PARENT INFORMATION ABOUT SAFE TECHNOLOGY USE FOR CHILDREN.

Recommended Screen Time

Current Australian Recommendations for children's daily use of all screens, including TV's, computers, tablets, phone screens and game are:

- no screen time for children under 2 years. This is an important time for children's brain development. Interactive play and connection with other children and adults is the best way for them to learn language skill, to learn to think creatively, solve problems and develop fine motor skills. Passive media viewing may keep toddlers entertained but it doesn't teach these important skills.
- one hour maximum for children under 5 years. Programs and games should be selected and monitored by parents and not include violence.
- two hours maximum of recreational screen time for children 5-18 years. This is in addition to screen use for school.
