

#### Year 4/5 Curriculum Resources Centenary Research

English Unit 3 Examining Media Texts is a Curriculum Resource document being modified in the 4/5 class, to fit in to the Centenary research being undertaken by the class.

In this unit, students listen to, read, view and interpret a range of news articles and reports from journals and newspapers to respond to viewpoints portrayed in media texts. Students apply comprehension strategies, focusing on particular viewpoints portrayed in a range of media texts.

The Learning Intention is - to understand what a feature article is and how it differs from a news article.

Students are developing an understanding of how authors use text structures, language and visual features to influence an audience and accept a particular point of view.

Students have been comparing feature articles and news articles from old newspaper cuttings from the years 2000 to 2010, and looking at the use of formal and informal language, fact and opinion.

When we look through the old cuttings, students are amazed to find photos and feature articles about past students, who they know now as young adults, and staff members, both past and present.

Student are planning to contact past students from the years 2000 to 2010 to request short interviews, either by phone, in person (with Covid-safe conditions in place), or via zoom, to find out about school life in the 2000's. If anyone from this period who attended EAS, is prepared to assist, please email the students via my address so we can make arrangements. Thankyou.






# Year 4/5 Food Sustainability Activity
