Science Week Activities

This week in my lessons (4/5 Science, 6/7 Geography and 8/9/11 Geography), we asked where and how food meets science. We discussed what food Science is and looked at past, present and possible future examples of science helping us produce food. We introduced ideas like sustainability, economics and opportunity. Then students broke into groups of 3-4, and considered the following ideas.

- Lincoln Weed is technically edible, nutrient rich and tough as. Could it ever become a resource rather than
 just an economic burden on primary producers?
- What would the perfect food crop for the Elliston environment look like? What features of existing plants would you combine if you could?
- Is eating more wild food really sustainable? What scientific knowledge would need to be known, and what
 laws and social attitudes would need to change, if some of the larger native animals found in our district (eg
 Kangaroos, Wombats, Emus & Cape Barren Geese) were ever to become edible, commercial, resources?

As you can see, these are some big ideas, and some students initially did not enjoy the fact there were often no right or wrong 'googleable' answers. As students talked to each other, discussed ideas, argued points, tried to find if any experts or data already existed to help support their arguments, introduced knowledge and experiences from their own lives, and sketched, drew and wrote down some of their thoughts around the issue though, this frustration and confusion lessened, until students were communicating in the types of terms and concepts that all real scientists use.

If you get the chance, ask your child about which topic they looked at, what they think and why they have come to that conclusion.









The 2/3 class have been looking at the history of the Nature Trail.
