SWIFT Internet

For the majority of this year Elliston Area School has had fast and reliable internet which is essential to deliver world-class education and to prepare students for the industries of the future. Since 2019 over 99% of schools and preschools across South Australia have received high-speed fibre optic internet through SWiFT.

Last week our SWiFT moved into phase two, providing our school with improved cyber security protection through SWiFT Portal. This powerful tool gives ICT staff and school leaders better visibility over the performance and capacity of their internet service.

It also offers advanced web filtering, giving staff the ability to easily control the online content students can access. This includes unique cyber welfare alerts for specific words, phrases and activity. If a student accesses concerning information online it will be flagged and notifications proactively sent to wellbeing and school leaders to help support the cyber safety and wellbeing of students.

This week we have taken the opportunity to remind our students of the ICT Agreement they signed at the beginning of the year and explained how the NEW SWIFT Portal provides staff with real-time alerts and visibility of students' online activities.

Q Fever Vaccinations

Wudinna Medical Practice is seeking people interested in receiving a Q-Fever Vaccination in 2021.

It is a once off vaccination to protect you from Q-fever, an illness passed on from stock and wildlife.

The Q-Fever immunisation consists of two stages, a blood and skin test and the vaccination if suitable. There must be a week gap between the two..

No Medicare rebate is applicable to this vaccination process and we do require minimum numbers to hold the clinic.

Blood & skin test (\$200.00) - 30th November 2021.

Vaccination (if required) (\$150.00) - 7th December 2021.




STEM

Have you ever wondered what is going on under your screen? The 4/5 class are exploring this exact question! So far we have discovered that digital systems (computers, devices and networks) represent images and text using binary information. Digital devices have hundreds of layers of tiny circuits that deliver electrical impulses. Digital systems use a combination of on and off states to deliver images and text to our screens. These on and off states are represented as 1s and 0s - the binary number system. We have been using binary windows to help explain our thinking as we move through this unit of work.

In R/1 STEM we have been learning how to publish our work using Word. We are very proud of our efforts! We have also enjoyed some critical and creative design thinking challenges involving limited quantities of recycled paper and sticky tape. After reading Goldilocks and the Three Bears students were challenged to create a chair that could support our class teddies. The second challenge posed the question 'What is the longest chain you can create with 1 A4 piece of paper?' Working in pairs there was lots of amazing discussion about how thick to cut each strip and how this would impact the final chain length. Using our maths knowledge we then compared, ordered and measured each chain. I always love watching these amazing little minds coming up with creative solutions and having wonderful conversations about how to overcome the challenges.
