The SA Ambulance Service (SAAS) Central Eyre teams are looking for volunteers to answer the call and join them, as the service launches a new community recruitment drive.

The service's latest campaign, Answer the Call, showcases volunteers from across the state responding to Triple Zero (000) calls. Getting behind the initiative, volunteers across Central Eyre – based in Cowell, Cleve, Elliston and Lock - have been speaking about the benefits of becoming a SAAS volunteer, which they say is easier than you think, with the opportunity to make a difference and gain life-long skills that can be used in everyday life.

Monika has been volunteering with the Elliston team for four years, and was drawn to volunteering with SAAS after moving to the area and wanting to assist her local community.

Monika says she has gained so much more. "I like helping my community, so when I moved to Elliston I was looking for a way to contribute. I have now gained confidence, extended first aid skills and improved my driving skills."

"I get a sense of pride when I can help to keep a vital service available to the community, as well as helping individuals in need", Monika says.

Monika wants you to answer the call! "The service is run by a small, dedicated team of volunteers, however we need more members. All training is provided and there are no out of pocket expenses."

- Volunteers undertake a minimum of 30 hours on the roster each month.
- SAAS currently has 1300 volunteers around South Australia.
- The training and uniforms are free, and volunteers are reimbursed for travel costs and child-care.
- Volunteers are also offered free Ambulance Cover for them and their immediate family (in accordance with current Terms & Conditions).
- SA Ambulance Service is a Registered Training Organisation RTO code 0264.
