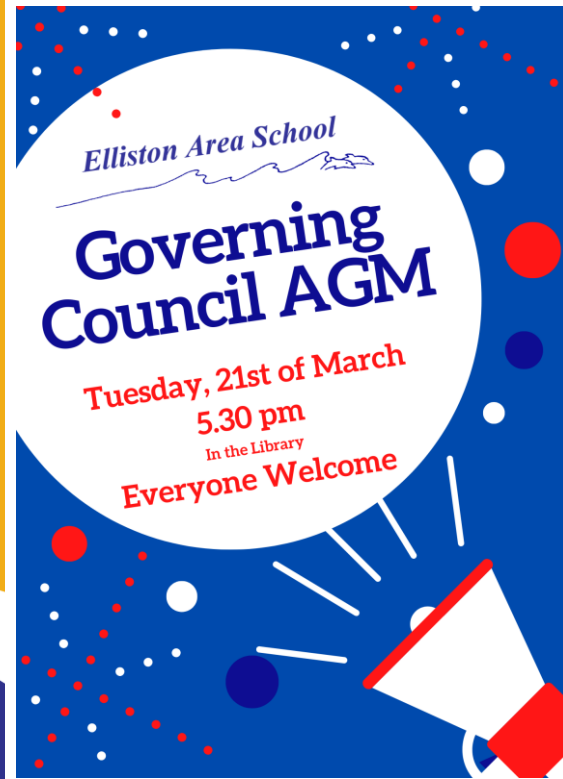

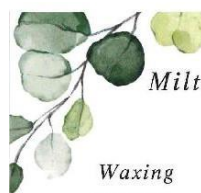

"Third-World countries like Somalia earn about \$4.9 billion dollars a year, where space industries like NASA spend about 4 billion dollars a year. That's one country, having five times less than a single space exploration company's budget..." "Earth's orbit is almost as polluted as Earth. After 70,536 documented launches about 70% of space junk is only 2,000 km's above earth's surface..."
