

on a regular basis. We have engaged with the Dogs Connect program who offer all the necessary training and resources to


We look forward to communicating with families more information over the coming weeks about Haze's training and transition to school and the measures in place to ensure we maintain a positive learning environment for all students.

### **Open Parachute**

This term we are delighted to introduce our students to the Open Parachute Program. We are extremely grateful to Andrew Taheny, the SANFL Game Development Coordinator - Eyre Peninsula and Brad Humphrey the SANFL General Manager of Game Development, who have been leasing with Casey Grice, Executive General Manager Community and Foundation at the Adelaide Crows Football Club, who have facilitated our involvement in this program in light of recent events. The Open Parachute Mental Health and Wellbeing resources are also supported by the Sebastian Foundation, Jules and Guy Sebastian.

The goal of the Open Parachute program is to teach practical mental health and wellbeing skills to students. The focus is on prevention, giving students an opportunity to practise skills for addressing any current or future challenges that might impact their mental health. By taking a proactive approach, the program helps schools move away from a triage response and towards a transformational, proactive approach.

The purpose of this program is to develop true, lasting resilience in students and will be delivered via the Health Curriculum by Stevie Romanowycz for the Primary students and Kristy Newton in the Secondary area.


